Infant and Toddler Connection

Providers should always refer members who have a developmental disability (birth up to age 3) to **Infant and Toddler Connection**. This referral should be made after completing a developmental screening on the member and identifying a potential developmental disability.



Developmental screenings should be completed for all children during well-child visits at **9**, **18**, and **30** months of age. The CPT code is **96110**.

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) screenings should be completed at **18 and 24 months of age**. The modifier U1 may be added to CPT code **96110** to indicate the screening is specifically for ASD.

These screenings should be completed using a standardized tool.

Early intervention services

Any infant or toddler in Virginia who isn't developing as expected or who has a medical condition that can delay typical development is eligible to receive early intervention services and support under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

The **Infant and Toddler Connection of Virginia** is a statewide early intervention program for children from **birth to age 3** who have developmental delays or disabilities or are at risk. The program includes collaboration with families, individualized assessments, and activities to encourage learning and development.



Making a referral

Each county and city in Virginia has a designated local point of entry for communicating and making referrals. There are two main ways to make a referral:
